Ho urges local officials to adopt spirit of CPC Central Committee 3rd plenum

Chief Executive Ho Iat Seng convened and chaired a session on Friday briefing top and senior local officials about the spirit of the third plenary session of the 20th Central Committee of the Communist Party of China (CPC), which was held from July 15 to 18.

According to a statement by the Macau Government Information Bureau (GCS) on Friday, Ho said during the session that local officials at all levels must ensure the full implementation of the central authorities' decisions and plans for Macau, enabling the

city to embrace the 75th anniversary of the founding of the People's Republic of China (PRC) and the 25th anniversary of its return to the motherland with "excellent results and new development achievements".

The session held at Government Headquarters on Friday afternoon was attended by Ho's five policy secretaries and their respective chiefs-of-cabinet, other principal officials, as well as all the heads of the government's about 70 bureaus and other bureau-level entities, according to the statement.

Ho was flanked by his five policy secretaries during the session.

The statement said that Ho delivered an important speech during the session, leading the officials to "earnestly" study and comprehend the spirit of the third plenary session of the CPC 20th Central Committee, where the five secretaries also shared their insights.

Milestone meeting

According to the statement, Ho pointed out that the third plenary session of the CPC

20th Central Committee was a milestone meeting convened at a critical period of building a strong country and moving towards national rejuvenation on all fronts through Chinese modernisation. The third plenary session adopted the Resolution of the Central Committee of the Communist Party of China on Further Deepening Reform Comprehensively to Advance Chinese Modernisation, systematically planning a string of strategic and overall major reform measures, Ho noted.

Chief executive candidacy nomination to run from Aug 29 to Sept 12

Macau's chief executive candidacy nomination period will run between August 29 and September 12, the Macau Special Administrative Region's (MSAR) Chief Executive Electoral Affairs Commission (CAECE) has announced.

According to a statement by the commission on Friday, anyone interested in running for the MSAR's top post can collect their candidacy proposal form from the electoral affairs counter at the Public Administration Building on Rua do Campo in person or through a designated representative and return the filled-in form to the counter during the nomination period.

The potential candidates also need to present a signed statement confirming that they uphold the MSAR Basic Law and are loyal to the People's Republic of China (PRC) and the MSAR.

The commission will vet the form and statement handed in by the potential candidate, which will also be submitted to the MSAR's Committee for Safeguarding

National Security (CDSE) for its binding appraisal of the candidacy application, which will assess whether the potential candidate upholds the MSAR Basic Law and is loyal to the PRC and the MSAR. The CDSE appraisal cannot be appealed.

The 400-member Chief Executive Election Committee will elect the MSAR's sixth-term head of government on Sunday, October 13. By law, all elections in Macau are held on a Sunday.

A potential chief executive candidate requires the endorsement of at least 66 members of the 400 electors, or 16.5 percent of its members, to get his or her candidacy off the ground.

According to the MSAR Basic Law and the Chief Executive Election Law, the chief executive must be at least 40 years old at the end of the nomination period, be a permanent local resident, hold Chinese nationality, does not have the right of abode in a foreign country, and must have "habitually" lived in Macau for at least 20 years.

According to the MSAR Basic Law, Macau's chief executive can serve no more than two consecutive five-year terms.

Ho Iat Seng, a former president of the Macau Legislative Assembly (AL) and ex-member of the Standing Committee of the National People's Congress (NPC), started his current term about a month before the COVID-19 pandemic began to impact Macau's economy, its tourism, entertainment and retail sectors in particular, for three years. Observers say that Ho's steady-handed policies and close coordination with the central government in Beijing succeeded in getting Macau through the pandemic relatively unscathed and preparing well its ongoing recovery.

Ho, born in Macau in June 1957, is a former business community leader. He began his political career in the 1970s as a member of the Chinese People's Political Consultative Conference (CPPCC) for Zhejiang Province. His family originates from Zhejiang.

Ho is widely expected to be the only candidate for the upcoming election on October 13.

Apart from the chief executive election in 1999, when there were two candidates – Edmund Ho and Stanley Au Chong Kit – vying for Macau's top post, all the other chief executive elections (2004, 2009, 2014 and 2019) only involved one candidate each time. ■

Addressing the seminar, which drew over 100 participants, MGTO Acting Director Cheng Wai Tong said that with tourism activities returning to normal, the scheme had fully resumed its assessments in both the catering and travel agency sectors this year. Businesses were joining the scheme "enthusiastically", he added.

Assessments for eligible catering businesses and travel agencies either joining for the first time or competing again have been conducted since mid-June based on the scheme's mechanism, format and judging criteria, according to the statement, adding that the evaluations consist of four Mystery Customer Assessments and a Service Manager System Audit.

Meanwhile, the statement noted that the QTSAS-accredited businesses of 2023 will go through two Mystery Customer Assessments in line with the scheme's "supervisory mechanism". The statement said that 372 businesses have fulfilled the criteria to enter this year's assessment process.

The statement added that 366 merchants finished the required number of Mystery Customer Assessments at the first stage, which involved 536 inspections.

MAICC aims to grasp business opportunities in Johor-Singapore SEZ

A business delegation of the Macao ASEAN International Chamber of Commerce (MAICC) visited the Johor State Government of Malaysia yesterday and toured the R&F Princess Cove and RTS (Rapid Transit System) railway projects there, and MAICC Chairman Kelvin Tan Hai Ching said he expected the delegation members to deepen their knowledge and grasp the business opportunities before the Johor-Singapore Special Economic Zone (JS-SEZ) is established, making full preparations for their future investments in the large-scale undertaking.

With the rapid changes in the global economy in recent years, the traditional strengths in manufacturing, medical equipment, electronics and electrical appliances remain an important basis for cooperation between Southeast Asia economies, particularly between Johor and Singapore. As an important result of the cooperation between Malaysia and Singapore, Johor State Executive Council Member and Chairman of the Investment, Trade, Consumer Affairs and Human Resources Committee Lee Ting Han told the delegation during vesterday's meeting that the Johor-Singapore Special Economic Zone will play a pivotal role in fostering

closer economic integration between the two countries and attracting various types of investment.

According to Lee, the state of Johor is the third most economically developed state in Malaysia, with a total area of 19,166 square kilometres and a population of about four million. He underlined that the state has the second-largest petrochemical industry in Southeast Asia, as well as a relatively well-developed semiconductor industry, adding that the manufacturing of medical equipment and furniture is also a traditional strength of the state situated in the south of the Malay peninsula.

Taking into account the resources, geography and manpower of Singapore and Johor, Lee said, there is tremendous potential for economic development in the region, especially in the Southeast Asian market, where the growing population is getting younger.

In order to promote close cooperation between Malaysia's Johor and Singapore, Lee noted, both sides put forward the idea of establishing the Johor-Singapore Special Economic Zone last year and conducted several rounds of negotiations this year, with plans to formally launch the project at the end of the first quarter of next year, covering 16 areas such as electronics and electrical, medical, pharmaceuticals,

aviation, specialised chemicals and logistics, striving to achieve interconnectivity and interoperability.

Lee also said: "With the gradual advancement of the Johor-Singapore Special Economic Zone, new opportunities for economic cooperation between Johor and Singapore will arise. In the future, the Johor-Singapore Special Economic Zone will not only bring economic growth to the two countries but will also provide a strong impetus for the development of the entire Southeast Asian market."

Speaking to the *Post* and *Macao Daily News* – Macau's top-selling English- and Chinese-language newspapers, respectively – after the meeting with Lee, Tan said that the success of economic zones can be traced back to Shenzhen, where the city has become a model thanks to its flexible economic policies and regional cooperation, adding that with the establishment of the Johor-Singapore Special Economic Zone (JS-SEZ) in southern Malaysia's Iskandar development corridor, both countries are holding on to the experience of Shenzhen and hoping to find a suitable path for their development by learning from it.

Tan pointed out that the free movement of people between two regions or countries is one of the key factors for the success of an economic special zone, suggesting Malaysia follow suit and introduce a "blue card" policy similar to that of Macau, to ensure that workers can move between the places with ease.

Tan said he believed that such a policy arrangement could maximise the potential of human resources and promote economic interaction within the region.

With the introduction of new policies and further upgrading of infrastructure, Tan said he expected the upcoming special economic zone, which, he stressed, was poised to become an economic cluster that attracts investment, facilitates the flow of talent, and strengthens regional connectivity, so that it would be able play an even more significant role in the economic development of Southeast Asia.

Organised by the MAICC, over 40 representatives of the Guangdong-Hong Kong-Macau Greater Bay Area (GBA), Macau in particular, embarked on their six-day fact-finding trip to Singapore and Malaysia on Thursday.

The delegation ended their three-day trip to Singapore on Saturday, during which they visited United Overseas Bank Venture Management (UOBVM) Private Limited, the Chinese embassy, the New Bahru creative cluster and the Orchard Road Station of the Thomson-East Coast Line in the Lion City. Dealer steals casino chips at least 6 times worth HK\$310,000: police

A male casino dealer was arrested on Friday for stealing chips at least six times worth HK\$310,000 in total since June, Judiciary Police (PJ) spokesperson said at a special conference on Friday.

The 37-year-old local suspect, surnamed Chan, had been working as a dealer in a casino in Cotai since October 2011.

According to the spokesperson, a staff member of a casino in Cotai reported to PJ officers stationed at the casino last Wednesday that a male casino dealer was suspected of stealing chips while he was working that day.

The Judiciary Police scrutinised the casino's CCTV footage from early Friday morning and discovered he stole six HK\$10,000

chips which the suspect hid in his underwear, when PJ intercepted him on the spot.

Under questioning, admitted that he had stolen chips five times previously worth HK\$250,000 in total starting from June, stealing HK\$50,000 each time, adding that after pilfering the chips each time, he hid the chips in his locker and smuggled them out of the casino later.

The Judiciary Police seized the HK\$60,000 in chips he had on him, and HK\$100,000 in chips in his flat. Chan told the police that he had gambled HK\$150,000 of the stolen chips away.

Chan was transferred to the Public Prosecutions Office (MP) last Friday, facing an aggravated theft charge, according to the spokesperson.

HONG KONG – A delegation of Chinese mainland athletes returning from the Paris 2024 Olympic Games will visit Hong Kong from August 29 to 31, the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region (HKSAR) government announced yesterday.

The delegation will attend a welcome reception and welcome banquet hosted by the HKSAR government, and visit the Hong Kong Sports Institute for exchange activities. Members will also attend three public events, including a Gala Show at Queen Elizabeth Stadium on August 30, and give sports demonstrations at the Queen Elizabeth Stadium and Victoria Park Swimming Pool on August 31.

HKSAR Chief Executive John Lee Ka-chiu expressed his sincere gratitude to the central government for arranging another visit of the Chinese mainland Olympians delegation, which he said "fully demonstrates its care for Hong Kong."

"Athletes of the national team, with their spirit of perseverance

4 men cheated out of 880,000 patacas in online-dating scam: police

The Judiciary Police (PJ) arrested two local men on Friday suspected of cheating four local men out of a total of 880,000 patacas in online-dating scams since July, PJ spokesperson said during a special press conference on Saturday.

According to the spokesperson, the four victims are local men, a young male, two middle-aged males, and an elderly male, while the two scammers are a 27-yearold local man surnamed Lo and a 29-year-old local man surnamed

The Judiciary Police received a report from one of the victims last Tuesday that in early August, he met a "woman" on an online dating platform who asked him to engage in a "rewarding task", where he would receive a "commission" by depositing money in two designated local bank accounts, and that, moreover, he would be able to have sex with her if he succeeded in doing so.

The victim initially followed the instructions and used his personal bank account to "finish the rewarding task", for which he received a purported commission. However, as the victim was persuaded to deposit more money, he then discovered that he could not retrieve any money, after which he became suspicious and reported

the incident to the police, who said that he had suffered a loss of about 78,000 patacas.

While investigating the case, the Judiciary Police discovered that three other men had been defrauded in the same way, including an elderly man who lost over 630,000 patacas.

The Judiciary Police identified and arrested two local men who owned the bank accounts used for collecting the fraud money. The police discovered that the duo had used their personal bank accounts to collect fraudulent payments and

launder money for fraud syndicates since July.

The duo were found to have handled about 300,000 patacas in fraudulent payments in their accounts, and the money was handed over to various fraud syndicates, for which they received a payment of 12,000 patacas and 5,400 patacas respectively.

The two suspects were transferred to the Public Prosecutions Office (MP) on Saturday, facing charges of money laundering and aggravated fraud involving a considerable amount of money.

Woman, 92, critical with influenza A

The Health Bureau (SSM) has announced that a 92-yearold local woman inflicted with chronic diseases is in a critical condition after being infected with influenza.

According to an SSM statement on Saturday, the woman came down with shortness of breath on Friday, after which she

was taken to the private Kiang Wu Hospital where she was hospitalised and diagnosed with influenza A complicated with double pneumonia.

The statement said that as the woman's condition did not improve after treatment, she was put on a ventilator and transferred to the intensive care unit (ICU) later that day.

She was in a critical condition at the time of Saturday's statement.

The statement said that the patient had not received a seasonal influenza jab. None of her family members living with her had come down with flu symptoms, the statement said.

Kiang Wu Hospital reported the case to the Health Bureau on Saturday. ■

CE Lee expects HK economy

HONG KONG - Chief Executive John Lee Ka-chiu said yersterday the city's economy was expected to improve next year.

During a two-hour public forum in Tai Po to solicit views for the upcoming Policy Address, Lee heard numerous appeals from the audience to prop up certain industries.

A securities worker said he had never seen so many brokerage firms shut down. While acknowledging efforts by the local government to lure investment from abroad, he said the sector had yet to see any material impact.

In response, Lee admitted

"difficulties" and "challenges" in the current environment. Lee said he believed investors were taking a cautious approach, citing factors such as the upcoming US presidential election, the interest rate development, as well as geopolitical uncertainties.

That said, "those who bet against Hong Kong in the long run will be the first to lose", Lee added.

"I believe that the global economic axis is shifting to the East. We should focus on ASEAN countries and the Middle East, which are the new engines for global development."

Lee was also urged to provide

more support to the cultural, sports, and tourism sectors, fresh off stellar performances by Hong Kong's Olympians at the Paris Games.

"Indeed, culture, sports and tourism have been emphasised as a whole. We have had great news recently with the birth of the twin panda cubs, while two more giant pandas are on their way as a gift from the central authorities," he said.

More consultation forums will be held in the coming weeks, before Lee delivers his third annual policy blueprint in October.
